UFO-OBSERVATIONS (pp. 66-69)

The three observations in this issue were all caused by a now fashionable stimulus, the so-called silent firework, fire balloons or Thai sky lanters launched in unison. On 20 May 2007, a mother and her son spotted and photographed 8 to 10 orange balls of light at Winnweiler, on 14 April 2007, a couple and their children saw a flying lantern or hot air balloon with fire underneath at Hünfelden (a single fire balloon), finally, on 19 May 2007, seven to ten strange flickering lights appeared over Remseck.

Here we briefly summarize cases received by other organisations, mainly sightings of so called silent fireworks.

AN INTERVIEW WITH ROBERTO PINOTTI (pp. 72-73)

Roberto Pinotti started to become interested in strange phenomena because his grandmother's hobby was parapsychology. In 1965, Pinotti and other Italian researchers founded a UFO group which, from initial scepticism, moved to belief in the ETH. Pinotti thinks that, once you have eliminated the explanations that do not work, you are left with the ETH, as the psycho-social hypotheses fails to explain the UFO problem. And although Pinotti thinks abductions are real, he doubts the large number of incidents quoted by American researchers and attributes their claims to sinister motives by cover-up agents. He is also interested in ancient astronauts and works on a book abourt vimanas.

He also notes a lack of progress in the field over the last 30 years, and thinks this is largely due to the blinkers ufologists wear – they sort out reports that do not fit preconceived ideas, and, especially in the US and the UK, are largely unaware of research that takes place outside of the English language.
