UFO OBSERVATIONS (pp. 130-138)

During a photo shoot (which explains the armed lady in red) on 30 May 2008 in Herne-Crange something stole into the picture that was only discovered later. The blurred white object most likely is an insect flying through the frame at the time of exposure. Another UFO that was only noticed when the image was looked at later is the black disc on a picture taken on 18 April 2007 at Arnstadt. It can well have been a Frisbee disc thrown in the neighbouring garden. Two points of light and two bows of light visible on a photo taken on 26 November 2008 at Bad Münstereifel were reflections of interior lights on a window pane. A UFO observed and photographed by a couple at Hartheim on 9 September 2008 is identified as a foil balloon. A UFO accidently caught on an iPhone image taken on 26 October 2013 at Euthal in Switzerland was an insect too, with the transparent wings visible on the photo. The last case of a UFO visible for 90 minutes which was taken over Schwerin on 23 February 2016 was identified as lenticularis cloud.

UFO RESEARCH AND THE ETH (pp. 139–149)

Recently, there has been a renewed interest in the ETH as an explanation of the UFO phenomenon. The author points out the weak points of the ETH, says it cannot be tested, and suggests that there are many more credible alternatives which should not be lost from view.

WHAT PSYCHOANALYSIS MAY CONTRIBUTE TO UFO RESEARCH (pp. 150–157)

Psychoanalysis, the author suggests, can be of great help in understanding the UFO phenomenon as the focus will be less on the object but more on the subject, the human witness who perceives the "object". This may well lead to a disillusion which means the illusion of the UFO as an object could disappear.
