

THE GEP PASSIVE RADAR CASE OF 20 SEPTEMBER 2024 AND POSSIBLE EXPLANATIONS (pp. 98–101)

We've had several articles on the Friesenheim-Oberweier case, here Josef Garcia looks at explanations which have been suggested. Among them were meteor clouds (vaporized meteoric material) or meteors turning into plasma. There are many resemblances to the first idea, including a passive radar trace of such an event, yet all witnesses stated that the phenomenon was stationary in the sky. We are still searching for an unknown natural event which might fit the evidence.

INDIRECT LIGHT ON BOARD A UFO – A QUICK SEARCH (pp. 101–106)

One feature of UFOs often reported by abductees is the indirect light – a room in a craft is illuminated, but the abductee sees no source of light. This happens to the extent that the indirect light is regarded as diagnostic of true cases. However, the indirect light is also often reported in contactee cases, such as Adamski, which are generally regarded as fake, as well as in early SF tales, fantastic fiction of the 19th century and of the pre-UFO age, as well as in folklore and myths.

THE MADAR NETWORK – A GLOBAL DETECTION DEVICE FOR UFOs/UAPs (pp. 106–110)

MADAR – Multiple Anomaly Detection and Automatic Recording – was established in the 1970s by APRO to track electromagnetic anomalies. The author explains how it works, where the stations are, and lists some of the UFOs that have been detected or confirmed that way.

UFO DEPARTMENTS AND PILOT OBSERVATIONS OVER PERU (pp. 111–116)

The author lists the development of the air force of Peru, which programmes were established to investigate UFOs, and lists some major incidents involving pilots and UFO – the first from 1959. In the most sensational case, on 11 April 1980, a pilot chased a saucer-liker UFO over La Joya for 21 minutes and shot at it. The UFO reappeared the next two days, causing a blackout in the AFB. Already a year before that, three flight trainers and six crew vanished in a plane at the same AFB. They have revealed that they are now in a secret alien base in Antarctica.
