

UFO OBSERVATIONS (p. 66– 68)

Starting in November 2024, a man at a place unknown started to experience terror by aliens or the NSA: He heard voices in his head, nanobots in his body tried to convince him to betray mankind. He didn't answer any mails asking for additional info; therefore, it is a case with insufficient information, although mental problems might offer an explanation. On 16 June 2024, a man observed an object some 100 m above him at Pleiskirchen, with pulsing red and white lights: This was identified as a gas balloon – a launch site is only 14 km from the place of the observation. A refugee who came from Syria in 2014 reported an encounter at Qamishli-Al-Suryan, Syria, in July 2014. The witness saw, some kilometre from him, and for some 10 seconds, a wavy kind of object some 100 m long with a smooth and reflecting surface. He also heard a hum, and has recreated his observation with AI. The case, having occurred so long ago, is classed as a case with insufficient information.

THE OZ FACTOR IN THE UFO CASES OF THE GEP, PART 1 (pp. 69– 88)

Of the c. 6000 sightings recorded to the GEP since 1972, 118 are classed as Problematic UFO (98 cases) or Good UFO (20 cases). André Kramer has focussed on these and looked for indications of what Jenny Randles has called the Oz factor, to see if it plays a role in German close encounters, too. 28 sightings were deemed by the author to contain the Oz factor, that is, some 23.73 per cent of the total. The paper lists these cases and then draws some statistics: 16 cases mention sounds before or during the sighting, 18 cases mention a change in the temporal experience of the witness, 9 cases talk about changes in the inner experience of the witness, and 8 cases mention strange animal behaviour (dogs barking, birds suddenly becoming silent). A second part will look into possible interpretations, including psychological explanations.

CONFERENCE OF THE COOPERATION INITIATIVE UFO RESEARCH (p.88–89)

At this conference, which took place on 25 and 26 April 2026 in Aschaffenburg and was organised by GEP, MUFON-CES and IGAPP, talks were given by Jochen Ickinger on witness interviews, by Jörg Kiefer on civilian and military air-traffic control, by Dr Wolfgang Arden on the physics of Burkhard Heim's multidimensional theory, by Gerhard Gröschel on the Italian UFO hotspot Valmalenco, by Michael Landwehr on an EMG data bank with entries on electromagnetic cases, and by Harald Havas on the UAP debate in the US.

FOO FIGHTERS – OLD ENIGMA, NEW FILES (p. 90–93)

The Trump administration is releasing new UFO files with a focus on unexplained cases. Among these are several tranches which deal with foo fighters. Though no new cases or evaluations have yet been released, content pages now in the public domain hint at such information. Also included is the history of the 415th Fighter Squadron to which most of the witnesses in the German theatre belonged.
