

UFO OBSERVATIONS (p. 70-78)

All three observations in this issue are photo or video cases. On 29 December 1998, two witnesses on the motorway Hamburg-Bremen videotaped a "dark ring which was clearly visible against the sky" near Sottrum. This circle drifted slowly westward and later dissolved. The GEP classifies this phenomenon as exhaust cloud. In 1975, a 13-year-old boy observed a bright light like a helicopter searchlight in the night sky over Kirchhundem. The light was silent and didn't move. An analysis of the photo shows that it is identical to a photo of the moon the boy took later for comparison. On 22 January 1999, a man waiting outside an automobile company's testing facilities at Stuttgart to take pictures of car prototypes observed and took pictures of a star-like object hovering above him. This was identified as a foil balloon (you can even see the air hose on one of the photos).

ADAMSKI'S VENUS SAUCER? (pp. 79-82)

In the 1920s, American inventor T.T. Brown experimented with model aircraft using the so-called Biefeld-Brown-effect. These models were nearly identical to the "flying saucer" photographed by George Adamski in 1952. Did Adamski use Brown's model as a blueprint for his hoax?

MILITARY MANOEUVRES LEAD TO UFO ALARM (pp. 83-84)

On January 12, 2000, several UFO sightings were reported in the region of Altmittweida, Saxony. All witnesses observed a "giant and bright object" followed by German army jets. Research uncovered that at the precise moment, there had been air force manoeuvres in the region with re-fuelling exercises.
