

**UFO OBSERVATIONS (pp. 162-170)**

This issue contains a good UFO case: In May 1991, an 18-year-old man reported a CE I at Mörfelden-Walldorf, near Frankfurt Airport. It was a disk-like object with concentric circles of light and a dome, which flew 150 ft above him. After all this time, he is still emotionally upset about his sighting. Although the UFO very much resembles a sky tracker, the fact of the impact it had on him, the buzzing noise it made and the perceived proximity has GEP class it as a GOOD UFO. On 29 December 2008, at a Crailsheim-Burgberg school, hobby astronomers took pictures of the constellation of Orion, in which an unidentified object appeared. Simulations show it to have been the satellite ASTRA 1KR.
