The cases include, among others, the classic flying saucer of Hochheim, 11 April 1974; the solid light from Jüchen, 24 May 1983, and the CE III from Ronneburg, 19 January 1991, all unidentified, the fake photo (with the help of a small model) from Fehrenbach, 25 October 1994, the famous Hamburg lens flare, 7 January 1982, as well as – completely natural – landing traces from Dierdorf (23 January 1981), Dorla (16 September 1982), and Bedburdyk (19 November 1982).
