

UFO-Observations (pp. 162–171)

This issue contains a new GOOD UFO case. In the second week of December 2013, a man lived through a very close encounter with an unidentified craft below the high tension-lines at Frimmersdorf power station at Grevenbroich-Frimmersdorf. It was only 20 m from him, had a diameter of 30 m and a height of 4 to 6 m. There was a barely audible tone from it, and it consisted of pieces that were dark with a rough surface, and gaseous seams in between. The UFO had been invisible, but had become visible due to power loss, as the witness thought. The object hovered, then translocated. It also changed form to become a futuristic plane before it disappeared by shooting into the sky. As no conventional object can behave in this way, and the object was close to the witness, this is a GOOD UFO tending to BEST UFO.

A UFO photographed on 31 December 2017 at Marl “which quickly changed position” was identified as a drone.
