

**UFO OBSERVATIONS (pp. 2–11)**

A black triangular object with lights in each angle which turned on its longitudinal axis and moved away and which was observed on 22 July 2000 at Stade has been classed as a GOOD UFO. In addition to a detailed sighting report, a radar track was obtained which possibly shows the trace of the object, as there is a coincidence in time of occurrence as well as direction of travel. Calculations show it must have been large or very large (between 75 and 1135 m in length), and that it moved with a speed of around 50 km/h.

A photo taken in 2005 at Southern Bavaria shows a tubular “UFO” which was explained as a development fault on the negative.

**THE Mt. WASHINGTON, NEW HAMPSHIRE, UFO-PHOTO FROM 1870–1871 (pp. 12–27)**

A stereo photo taken by Howard A. Kimball in the winter of 1870–1871 during a meteorological expedition on Mt. Washington in the White Mountains of New Hampshire allegedly shows a tube-like UFO. Internet pages have already shown that the cloud in the photo actually is a snow-covered rock, and the “UFO” a small tool, possibly for measuring snow depth. The authors of this article use the stereo characteristics of the image and mathematics to definitely proof that the “craft” is small, close to the camera, and possibly a board of wood left on site to provide measure.
