

**“The Closest Encounter” (pp. 98–111)**

Philip Mantle presents excerpts from his new book by Flying Saucer Press, “Pascagoula 1973: The Hypnosis Transcript” which offers the text of the “hidden tape” made in the Sheriff’s office, as well as “official” documents by Dr. James Harder, and new witnesses to the event, Maria and Jerry Blair who came forward with their testimony in 2018, and who confirm the witnesses’ reports to the minutest detail.

**Sightings of UFOs over Chile by Pilots (pp. 112–118)**

Chilean pilots have observed and reported UFOs quite often. And authorities have collected reports from 1968 (Meteorological Service) on. As times have changed, so have official attitudes – at present, scepticism seems to prevail in the CEFAA (a department of the aerospace office). The author lists the different institutions and attitudes, and focusses on a dozen or so unidentified cases in the airspace of the country – sea and land.

**Historic UAP Reports (pp. 119–123)**

From the files of German newspapers, the author lists press reports about strange aerial events. While most of the exotic sounding stories can be reduced to accounts of St Elmo’s fire, or whirlwinds, or disagreements between eyewitnesses about the trajectory of a meteor, at least one tale describes a ball of light coming from the ground and exploding into smaller lights, in September 1899 at Euskirchen.
