

Falsche Erinnerungen und UFO-Entführungen

Die meisten psychologischen Studien identifizieren Entführungserleber als geistig normale Menschen, dennoch lehnen die meisten Mainstream-Psychologen Entführungsberichte gewöhnlich als falsche Erinnerungen an unmögliche Ereignisse ab. Ein Überblick über die Debatte um wiedererlangte Erinnerungen und die Forschungsergebnisse zur der formbaren, rekonstruierenden Natur der Erinnerung ermöglicht den UFOlogen zu begreifen, dass Entführungen tatsächlich in vielem den Erinnerungen an Missbrauch und dessen Wiedererlangung gleichen. Einige Unterschiede lassen dennoch vermuten, dass wiedererlangte Erinnerungen an Missbrauch ihren Ursprung im falschen Erinnerungsprozess haben, Entführungserinnerungen jedoch unabhängig davon sind.
